THE SOLUTION:

-Ephesians 1:16 Colossians 1:18

And He is the head of the body, the <u>kahal</u>. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything He might be preeminent.

Ephesians 5:29-30

For no one ever hated his own flesh, but <u>nourishes</u> and <u>cherishes</u> it, just as Messiah does the *kahal* because we are members of His body.

Colossians 2:19

... and not holding fast to the Head, from Whom the whole body, nourished and knit together through its joints and ligaments, grows with a growth that is from God.

Ephesians 3:4-6

When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Messiah which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to His holy apostles and prophets by the spirit. This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Messiah Yeshua through the gospel.

Romans 15:20-21

... and thus I make it my ambition to proclaim the Good News, not where Messiah has already been named, lest I build on someone else's foundation, but as it is written, "Those who have never been told of Him will see, and those who have never heard will understand."

John 12:37-38

Though He had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in Him, so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "Lord, who has believed what he heard from us, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

Matthew 8:16-17

That evening they brought to Him many who were oppressed by demons, and He cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah: "He took our illnesses and bore our diseases."

1 Peter 2:24

So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep He was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so He opens not His mouth. In His humiliation justice was denied Him. Who can describe His generation? For His life is taken away from the earth." And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Yeshua.
