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Genesis 41:25

Now Joseph said to Pharaoh, "Pharaoh's dreams are one *and the same*. God has told to Pharaoh what He is about to do."

Genesis 41:33-34

"Now let Pharaoh look for a man discerning and wise, and set him over the land of Egypt. Let Pharaoh take action to appoint overseers in charge of the land, and let him exact a fifth *of the produce* of the land of Egypt in the seven years of abundance..."

Genesis 43:20-23

Seven Steps to Jewish Acceptance of Yeshua:
