## **Discussion Questions:**

- 5. Explain how it could be that Jacob portrays a deepening relationship with God, a relationship that goes even deeper than God's relationship with Abraham and Isaac.
- 6. Explain how passion is the key to action.
- 7. How did God put a fire into the hearts of the generation that crosses the Jordan, from Egypt onwards?
