1 Timothy 2:1

First of all, then, I urge that **entreaties** and **prayers**, **petitions** and **thanksgivings**, be made on behalf of all men,

Four Elements of Prayer

- a- **δεησις** = any request based upon need
- b- **προσεθχη** = (only used in regard to God)
- c- **εντευξις** = to hold intimate conversation with another
- d- **ευχαριστη** = expression of gratitude

Philippians 4:6

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by **prayer** and **supplication** with **thanksgiving** let your **requests** be made known to God.

Ephesians 1:11 ... according to His purpose who works all things after the counsel of His will,

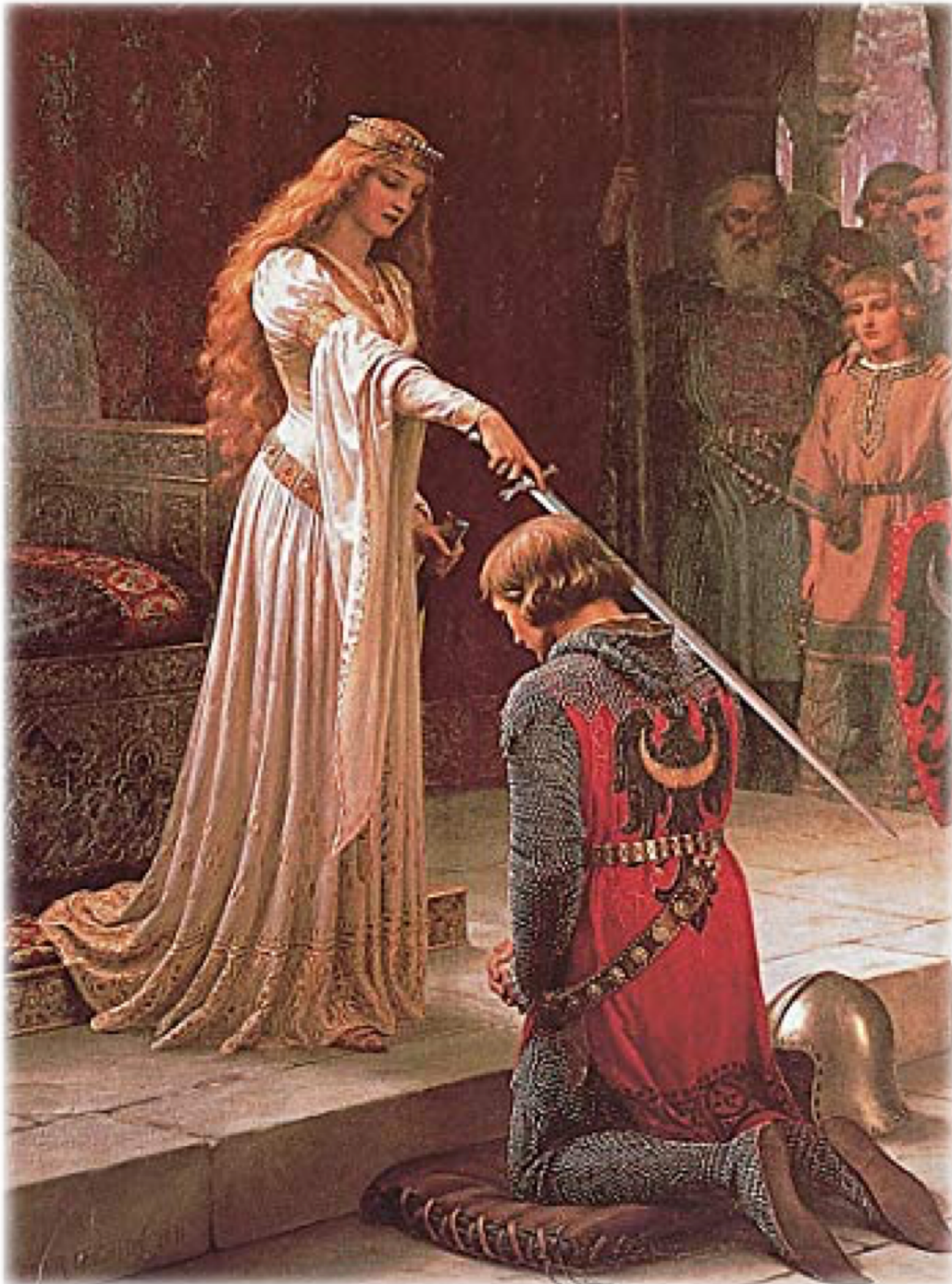
Job 42:1-2 Then Job answered Adonai and said, “I know that You can do all things, and that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted.”
