Nehemiah 9:1

Now on the twenty-fourth day of this month the sons of Israel assembled with **fasting**, in **sack-cloth** and with **dirt upon them**.

Fasting $\neq Lust \text{ of the flesh}$ Sackcloth $\neq Lust \text{ of the eye}$ Dirt on head $\neq Pride \text{ of } Life$

Nehemiah 9:2

The descendants of Israel separated themselves from all **foreigners** and stood and confessed their sins and the iniquities of their fathers.

Deuteronomy 31:16

Adonai said to Moses, "Behold, you are about to lie down with your fathers; and this people will arise and play the harlot with the **foreign** gods of the land, into the midst of which they are going, and will forsake Me and break My covenant which I have made with them."

A: Blessings

Deuteronomy 29:18-20

"... so that there will not be among you a man or woman, or family or tribe, whose heart turns away today from Adonai our God, to go and serve the gods of those nations; that there will not be among you a root bearing poisonous fruit and wormwood. It shall be when he hears the words of this curse that he will boast, saying, 1 will have peace though I walk in the stubbornness of my heart in order to destroy the watered land with the dry.' Adonai shall not be willing to forgive him, but rather the anger of Adonai and His jealousy will burn against that man, and every curse which is written in this book will rest on him, and Adonai will blot out his name from under heaven."

Do not view blessings merely as gifts rained down from above, view them as rungs in a ladder by which we can ascend into God's presence.

Revelation 2:1-5

To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: The One who holds the seven stars in His right hand, the One who walks among the seven golden lampstands, says this: "I know your deeds and your toil and perseverance, and that you cannot tolerate evil men, and you put to the test those who call themselves apostles, and they are not, and you found them to be false, and you have perseverance and have endured for My name's sake, and have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have left your first love. Therefore, remember from where you have fallen, and repent and do the deeds you did at first; or else I am coming to you and will remove your lampstand out of its place-- unless you repent.

Quotes:

Because children have abounding vitality, because they are in spirit fierce and free, therefor they want things repeated and unchanged.
