(Leviticus 21-26:2)

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1 Corinthians 5:11

But now I am writing to you not to associate with anyone who bears the name of brother if he is guilty of [A] **sexual immorality** or [B] **greed**, or [C] is an **idolater**, [D] **reviler**, [E] **drunkard**, or [F] **swindler** – not even to eat with such a one.

2 John 1:9-11

Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the teaching of Messiah, does not have God. Whoever abides in the teaching has both the Father and the Son. If anyone comes to you and does not bring this teaching, do not receive him into your house or give him any greeting, for whoever greets him takes part in his wicked works.

2 Samuel 8:18

And Benaiah the son of Jehoiada was over the Cherethites and the Pelethites, and David's sons were kohanim.

The word "Kohen" refers to "one who serves." In its most common usage, it refers to a Kohen who performs the Temple service, but it is also used properly, as in this case, for one who serves the government.

Summary

A priest...

- Must not live according to his feelings
- Must be able to stand and walk without stumbling

- Must be mature and of full stature
- Must have unimpaired vision to see things in the light of truth
- Must be spiritually whole in his heart and in his deeds
- Must be fruitful

- Review the physical disqualifications for a priest.
 Which of these represent areas of your own life in which you need to do repair? Share, if appropriate.
- Review the three groups in 23:22. To which group do you belong? Do you need to change groups?
- Considering the discussion of shmitta years, is God's blessing always a sign of God's favor?

NOTES:

- 2 Corinthians 5:7 For we walk by faith, not by sight.
- **2 Kings 6:15-17** When the servant of the man of God rose early in the morning and went out, behold, an army with horses and chariots was all around the city. And the servant said, "Alas, my master! What shall we do?" He said, "Do not be afraid, for those who are with us are more than those who are with them." Then Elisha prayed and said, "O Adonai, please open his eyes that he may see." So Adonai opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw, and behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.
- Exodus 12:11,13 In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the Adonai's Passover [פסה, Pesach] ... The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over [פסה, Pesach] you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.
- Exodus 22:20 "Whoever sacrifices to any god, other than Adonai alone, shall be segregated [הרם, cherem] to destruction.
- **Joshua 6:18** But you, keep yourselves from the things **segregated** [הַרֹח, *cherem*] to destruction, lest when you have devoted them you take any of the devoted things and make the camp of Israel a thing for destruction and bring trouble upon it.
- **Leviticus 27:21** But the field, when it is released in the jubilee, shall be a holy gift to Adonai, like a field that has been **segregated** [מרמ, *cherem*]. The priest shall be in possession of it.
- **Leviticus 22:23** You may present a bull or a lamb that has a part **too long** [שרוע, saruah] or too short for a freewill offering, but for a vow offering it cannot be accepted.
- **Isaiah 28:20** For the bed is too short to **stretch oneself** [שרע, sara] on, and the covering too narrow to wrap oneself in.
- Proverbs 24:16 For the righteous falls seven times and rises again...
- Psalm 68:15 O mountain of God, mountain of Bashan; O mountain of many peaks [גבנון, gibnon], mountain of Bashan!
- **1 Kings 19:12** And after the earthquake a fire, but Adonai was not in the fire. And after the fire the sound of a **thin** [דק, dak] whisper.
- **Exodus 16:14** And when the dew had gone up, there was on the face of the wilderness a fine, **thin/fine** [דק, dak] thing, fine as frost on the ground.
